ANDREA HANS IMPROVING IN INDIANA

CHURUDUSTO, Ind. – Team Full Throttle NASCAR Driver Development racer Andrea Hans has shown steady improvement over her first three legends car races at Indiana's fast, high-banked Anderson Speedway.

Hans, a 16-year-old rookie legends car racer, feels she is keeping up with the learning curve after years of quarter-midget racing.

"It's been a steep learning curve, that's for sure. Anderson is a really fast track and right now I'm just trying to learn everything I can and keep up with the drivers who have more experience than me, which is mostly everyone," she quipped.

Hans finished ninth in Saturday night's 20-lap legends car feature at Anderson. Being a rookie in the division, Hans is considered a member of the Young Lions (beginner legends racer) class but races with Pro and Semi-pro drivers at Anderson.

"They combine everyone because there are only about 15 legends cars at Anderson. So I'm out there with the best, but I think it's good because I can learn a lot from them and try to keep up.

"We've had our mechanical obstacles so far, but I think things are going pretty well. We're going to Charlotte in late July so I can work with Kyle (Beattie, of Kyle Beattie Racing) and Tom (Baker, of Team Full Throttle) and their group. We hope to continue learning until then and hopefully learn a bunch more when I'm in Charlotte," Hans added.
